Events

Workshops for post-grad students have become yearly events at the Stiftung. The Centre for Environmental and Technology Ethics ran the fifth such workshop in May, 2010. The Centre for Legal Theory has followed suit and held its second in November 2010. Thanks to all participants in both workshops and to the good grace in which those used to holding the floor let their youngers and betters have it for a few hours. A workshop on Valerie Kerruish's ongoing struggles with the awkward ideas of *The Wrong of Law* was held in November 2009. Many thanks to all participants.

Yearbook

The fourth volume of the ASFPG's yearbook *Dilemmata: Jahrbuch der ASFPG* was published in November 2009. 350 copies were distributed as previously to various university departments — mainly philosophy departments — and to recipients of this Newsletter. All Yearbooks are available in pdf format on our website. Individual contributions are separately downloadable. No volume was published in 2010. Our attention turned to a publication series — *Schriftenreihe der ASFPG*.

Publication series

The *Schriftenreihe der ASFPG* is a series of individually authored or edited monographs in the research fields of the ASFPG. The first two volumes were published by Der Andere Verlag in December 2010. Volume one is Jeannine Purdy, ... *Just One Damn Thing after Another: Colonialism, Economics, the Law and Resistance in Western Australia*; volume 2 is Uwe Petersen, *Die logische Grundlegung der Dialektik: Ein Beitrag zur exakten Begründung der spekulativen Philosophie 2. Auflage dreissig Jahre später*. We will be sending a

flyer with further information soon, when the books are available. It is our hope that this series, which aims to fill gaps left in the commerce of the publication industry, will receive your support. Further volumes are planned for 2011. We are open to queries regarding manuscripts which might be published in the series. PhD theses fitting the research areas of the Stiftung and suitable for publication as a monograph are especially welcome.

Grants and Stipends

Dr Irene Watson, Associate Professor in Aboriginal Studies at the University of South Australia was granted a stipend by the ASFPG to support publication of her work in 2010-2011. The ASFPG paid a publication subsidy to support publication of Dr Herwig Grimm's *Das moralphilosophische Experiment* Mohr Siebeck, Tübingen, 2010. A stipend to establish an 'ASFPG Scholarship in Legal Theory' offered by the Law School at Glasgow University is currently being planned.

The prize offered by the the Centre for Speculative Logic (see *Dilemmata* v.2 (2007) at 189/190) has not yet been collected and remains on offer.

Library

The library at the ASFPG now has a substantial collection on mathematical logic and classic proof theoretical texts.. A philosophical second string is oriented toward philosophical logic and texts in the tradition of German idealism. The library includes a small number of legal theory books, largely representing texts that have been discussed in workshops. Herwig Grimm's *Das moralphilosophische Experiment* Mohr Siebeck, Tübingen, 2010, Steffan Roth, *Markt ist nicht gleich Wirtschaft: These zur Begründung einer allgemeinen Marktsoziologie* Carl-Auer Verlag, Heidelberg, 2010, and Gavin Sullivan and Ben Hayes, *Blacklisted: Targeted sanction, preemptive security and fundamental rights*, ECCHR, Berlin 2010 have been received with thanks from workshop participants.

The library is open to the use of researchers.
