Dear workshop participants!

I am happy to officially **confirm** your participation in the above mentioned workshop 18-20 September 2013. We have now filled up the workshop with altogether 12 participants, 9 of which are PhD students, and we have 3 confirmed resource persons, with Ragnar Fjelland and Silvio Funtowicz as our main “external” resource person. We can announce that we had a record-breaking response from you in regard speed of feedback and number of positive responses, i.e. all! This time, only 4 of you have not been to any previous ASFPG workshop before. We are very happy to welcome all of you to the workshop!

Ulrike has provisionally reserved rooms for you at the Hotel Stephan. Many of you might already have sent the **registration form**, but those who have not yet done so, are hereby asked to do this **as soon as possible**, but certainly before 20 June 2013 .

In this letter I send you also a provisional schedule for presentations and some practical information. In particular I ask you to book your travel to Hamburg as soon as possible in order to secure reasonable airfares, and to inform Ulrike about your travel plans.

All presentations are set for ca 45 minutes, followed by ca 30 minutes discussion, but we can be (a bit) flexible. All participants present something, usually either a project description (PhD project), or a part of their PhD / publications. As lectures by the resource persons are in general very much appreciated, Silvio, Ragnar and I might present something as well – even if some of you might have heard us before. - If you for some reason would like to have a different sequence of presentations, please let us know.

Participants need now to think what they would like to present in the workshop. As usual, presentations using Power Point are encouraged, but not obligatory. We also have an “old-fashioned” blackboard we can use. We ask you to send us a **title** of your presentation / project and a short **abstract** (usually between ½ -3 pages), preferably by **1 September 2012**. You may of course also want to distribute text that extends a normal abstract, e.g. a draft of a chapter or article that you work on, but you should be prepared that not everybody has the time to read longer files before the workshop. The collected material will then be distributed by Ulrike to all participants before the workshop.

Practicalities:

Hotel accommodation: Have you communicated to Ulrike Horway at the ASFPG secretariat the precise dates for arrival and departure? Some of you may want to arrive earlier or may want to leave later; in this case it is particularly important that Ulrike knows about your preferences. As indicated in the first circular, the ASFPG pays also for the night from Tuesday to Wednesday and / or from Friday to Saturday, if that is your preference. If you want to stay even longer, then you need to cover the additional expenses yourself.

Travel: We recommend that you book your travel as soon as possible, if you have not done so already. The usual conditions apply: Travel to Hamburg and back by airline or train, including transport to and from airports, will be covered on the condition that inexpensive / economy class flight reservations are made. Some of you may have to think about sending in a visa application early.

We ask you to contact Ulrike Horway directly before finalizing your travel arrangements, or if you should be in doubt about the costs or any other aspects of your proposed travel. Also, if you for some reason are unable to pre-pay the ticket and cannot wait for reimbursement until after the workshop, you may ask Ulrike if she can book the travel for you. Ulrike will in any case send out a map that gives you the precise location of the hotel and the Stiftung.

Per diem: A per diem of 30,- Euro is offered for participants. You receive your per diem in cash at the start of the workshop. Lunches (Sandwiches) from Monday to Wednesday are covered by the ASFPG. The ASFPG further invites you to a small reception (drinks and nibbles) on Monday and to the workshop dinner Tuesday evening. All other expenses during the stay are covered by the participants (- that is why you get a per diem!).

Reminder - Your action list:

- Fill out the **registration form** and mail it to the ASFPG by **20 June 2013, unless you already have done so.**
- **Book your travel to Hamburg, unless you already have done so.** Contact Ulrike to confirm.
- Choose a **title** for your presentation and prepare an **abstract**, and / or the Power Point presentation. Send title and abstract to the ASFPG by **1 September 2012.**
- Read the distributed abstracts from other participants once they arrive by email so that you are prepared for the discussions.
